You are **George von Altenburg (65):**

You've been managing the family company's hedge funds since you married your wife Dorothea. Although she brought the company and the money into the marriage, you alone have made yourself what you are today: incredibly rich and prestigious. Success suits you well and – contrary to what your jealous competitors claim – it was not from luck. You earned the millions through sharp trading and hard work. Of course, you wish your only son had looked up to you and had eagerly learned by watching every step you took. But you've been disappointed with Alexander from the time he took his first step. No internship, no expensive private schools, and none of the mentors provided to him could steer him in the right direction. Instead, through drugs, parties, embarrassing episodes with women, and catastrophically failed business endeavors, Alexander has taken your money and dragged your family name through the mud.

And, to make things even worse, your wife is now demanding that you leave the business to your useless son. Years ago, when you still had some love left for Alexander, you signed a clause allowing him to take over the business when he turned 30. But letting him assume command now means forfeiting your life's work. Due to him, your business is currently in a crisis. How could you possibly turn over your position to him?

Despite all your concerns, your wife was still campaigning for Alexander to be your successor and she came up with a plan to improve his reputation. Every Wednesday, the hugely popular TV show *The One* runs on almost every television set in the country. Even those who are not actively following it can't help but see news about the show on social media or hear about it in the office. This year your son has become the new Rose-Bearer. You have to acknowledge that Alexander has staged himself very well as a pure, honest, and charming bachelor ready to start a family. But you know him. That's why you can't let your wife and son go through with this charade.

The show's producer, Nina King, is a pragmatic person. For a small fee, she agreed to spring a trap for her star. The plan was to publicly expose Alexander in the final broadcast. Then, you brought Cheyenne into the plan – she would seduce Alexander while secretly recording it all. This would be broadcast after Alexander's very public engagement to another woman. This would destroy your son's carefully crafted image. In a stroke you would be able to distance yourself from him once and for



all, thereby saving everything you've worked on all your life. After all, even your wife would have to realize that Alexander wasn't fit to run the family business.

Your feelings about the others:

Cheyenne Aleon (victim): If she'd simply stuck with the plan and hadn't tried to take control from you, she would still be alive.

Samantha Edwards: Although this candidate is incredibly sexy, she's certainly not good enough for the name "von Altenburg."

Nina King: You have respect for this hardheaded, competent woman. You trust her to finally ruin your son's reputation.

Benjamin Ballhaus: The cameraman is sloppy and unreliable. You have absolutely no respect for artists and softies.

Alexander von Altenburg: You're looking forward to the day your son is excised from the family and will no longer be a burden for you.

Judith Freud: Psychotherapy is only for the weak, like your son. She should just keep away from you with her nonsense.

Ella Newhouse: This girl seems to have really taken a fancy to your son. She seems sadly naive, simple, and without character.
